THE THREE Cs: STRATEGIES FOR PARENTS OF CHILDREN AGES 5 – 11

PROTECTIVE FACTORS	PARENTS' ROLES
Connection	Spend time with the child: listen, follow, guide, play
	Facilitate connection with other adults and peers: link; advocate; "coach" social skills
	Teach and model empathy, seeing through another's eyes
Competence	Provide a platform for autonomy and mastery: "just enough" help and encouragement
	Model and coach the child in social competence (e.g. how to make and keep friends, seek and offer help, respect differences, and resolve conflicts)
	Identify and nurture the development of domains of competence (e.g., the arts, sports, academics, special interests)
Contribution	Engage the child in planning and decision-making with the family (e.g. meals, activities, trips, budgeting, solving problems)
	Expect the child to contribute to the work of the household
	Model and engage the child in contributing to the community
	Explicitly teach the values of giving and service
